


Fig.1 COMPOSITION OF STUDENT (2018-19)




Fig.2: Yearly New Entrants Trend




Fig.3: Yearly Total Enrolment Trend




Fig.4: Student Drop-out Trend

5. Events & Activities during the Academic Year

2nd July, 2018

The IQAC ventured to bring out the ordinances of the college passed in different times in book form to make it available to all institutional functionaries and stakeholders. The Coordinator compiled the Oriental College Ordinances No. 1 to 30 into a single soft copy and published in book form for the first time with 100 copies on behalf of the Cell and the College. It was released by the Principal in his office chamber.

10th July, 2018:

Students of IT&ITES took up industry visit programme at IT Park, Mantri Pukhri as part of the curriculum. All 28 students participated in the visit observing tools and activities, interacting with the official, listening to experts giving lecture using smart board.

16th July, 2018:

As a part of office automation, a college desk window application management software was developed by NetworkMaster Software Solutions Pvt. Ltd., Imphal during July 16 to September 6, 2018 at the cost of Rs.88,000/- for enhancing management of admission, examination, student fee and financial accounting and college Library management.

8th August, 2018:

First Penmanship Contest (institutional level) organized on the theme 'Handwriting for Excellence' comprising events of (i) Spot Handwriting of 1000 words in English and (ii) Essay Writing on the topic 'Manipur'. Results were declared in (i) overall first three positions and (ii) event-wise first five positions of the two streams. About 45 students participated and present in the programme.

15th August, 2018:

A march past contingent of the college participated in the Independence Day Celebration organized by the state government.

23rd August, 2018:

Submitted 3 Best student Interns of the college for Swachh Bharat Summer Internship (SBSI) Programme of 100 hours activities to the Registrar, Manipur University to compete for State best 3 Inters as per selection notification dated the 10th August, 2018. They are N. Rishi Kumar (B.A. Sem. 4), M. Menita B.Sc. Sem. 4) and K. Tina (B.Sc. Sem.2) respectively holding 1st, 2nd and 3rd position.

8th September, 2018:

As resolved in the 4th meeting of the Governing Body after having observed the acute shortage of essential staff in the college, the Principal submitted an application to the Director of University & Higher Education, Govt. of Manipur requesting for making arrangement for filling the vacant positions in the college Library, Laboratory and administrative office so that the college academic activities can carry out smoothly and qualitatively.

12th September, 2018:

A 1-Day Educational and Career Counselling Programme organised in the college in association with the Aptech Learning, Imphal functioning under the ageist of Aptech, Mumbai, as part of their scheme of "Youth Development Program". The Managing Director of the Imphal Centre Mr. Rohi Y. delivered lecture and information to the participating students on educational and career oriented programmes focussing on Aviation, Hospitality and IT sector. Seven teachers and 64 students were present. There witnessed an active interaction with the students as the expert invited to them.

2nd October, 2018:

The college performed 'Swachhta Hi Seva' on Gandhi Jayanti in and around the campus. NSS volunteers, Students' Union and staff led by the Principal jointly organised the cleanliness service.

8th October, 2018:

A one day College social service was carried out as part of the National Cleanliness Day / Swachhta Bharat Abhiyan. 12 teachers and 50 students took part in the programme.

6th November, 2018:

Director of University and Higher Education, Government of Manipur visited the college and inspected the on-going development of infrastructure including new construction of four Science class rooms and toilet having separate provision for boys and girls.

Later on another team of the State Project Director, RUSA, Manipur inspected on March 9, 2019 the development of classrooms by way of repairing, renovation and construction at the cost of Rs.1,14,30,000/- funded under RUSA.

3rd February, 2019:

As part of staff welfare and recreation, the college authority organised a one day annual staff excursion at tourist spots –Sangaithen, Imphal West district and Chadong resort, Ukhrul district.

24th February, 2019:

State Level Open Written Quiz Competition was organized in the college in collaboration with History Club of the college and selected first three positions for cash prizes and eleven consolation cash prizes.

2nd March, 2019:

The 55th Annual Inter Moral Sports Meet 2018-19 began from this day with an opening function preside by Shri L. Mani Singh (Coordinator, IQAC and V.P., Students' Union), with Dr. S. Ranjit Singh (Principal) as Chief Guest and Kh. Debendra Meetei (Dean of Science) and Dr. Kh. Aruna Devi (Dean of Arts) as Guests of Honour. The students' week programme continued upto March 10 with a variety of items of games, cultural items and other cocurricular activities. Teachers were also involved as in-charges and juries.

5th March, 2019:

Financial Assistance under 'Star College' Scheme of DBT Granted. The Department of Biotechnology, New Delhi, Ministry of Science & Technology, Government of India, has

granted financial support for strengthening of Life Science and Biotechnology Education and Training at undergraduate level in its 'Star College Scheme' to Oriental College (Autonomous) on March 5, 2019 initially for three years. The total project cost for the term will be Rs. 104.00 lakhs which would enhance the academic, interdisciplinary teaching-learning activities of Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology & Mathematics departments of the College.

6th April, 2019:

A one day Lecture cum Interaction session on Gender Equality: Nature and Issues was organised by the IQAC in collaboration with the Students' Union of the college as part of the course of Women Empowerment. K. Biplob Singha, a faculty of political Science gave a lecture on the topic and had interaction session with the students participated in the programme.

14th May, 2019:

Dr. S. Nabadwip Singh, Department of Physics of the college joined a consultative team with radio-active detection machine to assist the Home Department, Govt. of Manipur in detecting Uranium component suspected in an alleged explosive packet lodged by an unknown person at a place in Moreh, a border town of Tengnoupal district. The other experts in the team were Prof. P. Sumitra (Physics Dept., M.U.), Dr. B. Arunkumar (Radiology Dept., RIMS) and Dr. N. Manoranjan (Physics Dept., M.U.). Local media reported that the team dispelled the suspicion.

5th June, 2019:

The World Environment Day was observed on the theme- Air Pollution in the college with teachers and students. The activities were (i) Continuous plantation of plants and (ii) Post Plantation Care. The special guest of the programme was Shri L. Iboyaima Singh, Joint Director, Directorate of University & Higher Education, Govt. of Manipur.

21st June, 2019:

The International Yoga Day observed by the staff and the student volunteers of NSS Unit-I and Unit-II of the college. Meditation and Yoga practice was performed by the participants in the Conference Hall with two lady instructors. Altogether 64 students and 14 teachers participated in the programme.

26th June, 2019:

Under the initiative of IQAC, the NSS Units and the Students' Union jointly organised an awareness programme in relation with the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking in the Conference Hall of the College. 47 students and 9 teachers were present. Kh. Debendra Meetei, Dean of Science, and Dr. M. Phalguni Singh, Asst. Prof. of Chemistry delivered lectures on the issue. The Coordinator of IQAC presided over the programme.

28th June, 2019:

A 1-Day Faculty Development cum Workshop programme on 'Text and Narrative: Reflections on Quantitative Research Methodology' was organised on this day in collaboration with Department of Economics, M. B. College, Imphal with resource person Prof. A. Bimol Singh (Centre of Political Science Studies, J.N. University, Delhi. The opening

function was presided by Shri L. Mani Singh, Coordinator of IQAC of the college with Prof. A. Bimol Singh as Chief Guest. Altogether 40 teachers participated in the programme.

28th June, 2019:
