- > Students-teachers are well aware of Moodle and Google classes.
- > There are many economically poor students who cannot afford a smart phone. Again poor internet service interrupt online classes. Students are lost in Lab learning. So it requires reopening college with proper SOP.
- ➤ Offline is far better than online where students can address issues face to face with the teachers.
- Offline is a must for practical involving subjects. Otherwise there will be education gap.
- For science students hands-on training is a must.
- Proper interaction & practical classes
- Yes. We are very accustomed to online activities. We must not take risk.
- ➤ Teachers and students are well adjusted to online classes for now. The state can consider reopening of colleges once it is entirely free from covid, positively in the next year.
- ➤ Online class is highly necessary in pandemic situation. But now the situation is somewhat better improved. Not only this, most of the students who do not have resources to attend online classes and those who live in remote areas of the state suffer a lot. Therefore physical class is required as soon as possible.
- ➤ Offline mode of teaching might be preferable for students requiring practical learning. However, online mode is preferably better now as opening of colleges without proper preparation might be risky.
- Most students might still be unvaccinated and deleterious effects for the teachers and their families and students in case of emergence of a positive person inside the campus is evident. Online classes garner maximum presence from the students yet mindful of its limitations. Therefore, few weeks of monitoring of the daily positive rate and vaccination of the students be carried out before reopening the college.
- ➤ Offline mode is good for proper interaction with students, better understanding of topic. Yet we cannot neglect the ongoing situation of the covid. Before going to offline mode, there must be proper sanitization, vaccination etc.
- > During offline classes, teachers can provide individual attention to the students.
- ➤ I personally feel that as the state is not yet covid 19 free, the online mode of teaching learning should be practised till favourable conditions arrive.
- We have many problems to take online class for example electrical problem. So it is


better to do classes in blended mode that is online and offline, e.g. 3 days online and 2 days offline with strict covid 19 SOP in a week.


Action Taken: the analysis and result of the opinion poll was paced in a joint meeting of all staff, students' union members, local parents and alumni and discussed. Based on the poll result, the meeting decided to send the following resolutions to the Director, University & Higher Education:

- i. Reopening of college and resuming offline/physical classes with proper COVID 19 SOP will be acceptable at this pandemic improving juncture.
- ii. As almost all the teachers and staff of the college have been vaccinated even with  $2^{nd}$  Dose, a vaccination drive for eligible students should be arranged by the authority in the college before reopening classes.
- iii. If the college is to re-open, it should get, or be provided with, safe sanitisation plan first. iv. The college should develop a befitting strategy for distancing of the students themselves in attending classes.
