#### The College at a Glance

The Oriental College was established in the year 1963 as a private college under the guidance of late Shri Nongthombam Ibomcha Singh (alias Tera Lai), a renowned politician and social worker, with physical and monetary support from a number of people of this area. The college, with Under-Graduate Science and Arts Prorammes, is affiliated to Manipur University. It is recognized by the UGC under u/s 2f and 12(B) of its Act. Since its inception, the college has produced a number of academicians, politicians, social workers, outstanding sports In its road of progression, the college was persons, etc. accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Committee (NAAC) on the 8th January, 2011. The College was reaccredited by NAAC for its Cycle-2 A & A on 23rd January, 2017. Presently, Oriental College is the only the Autonomous College in Manipur starting from 2014-15 session.

The college is located at Takyelpat, Imphal about 3 kilometers away from the heart of the Imphal City along the NH 39 (Imphal-Jiri section). The sprawling, serene and green college campus of about 7.5 acres, provides the best atmosphere including modern infrastructure conducive to academic and other dedicated research. The academic Degree Programmes offered in the college have a distinct focus on Science & Arts along with career oriented Vocational Programmes and other short term courses, reflecting the objectives enshrined in its vision-mission.

Since the last five years, the college has engaged itself in the process of capacity building, like Infrastructure & Human Resource Development. The college has made tremendous efforts in developing it into world class standard college incorporating the ever changing scientific & socio cultural

milieu. With the implementation of Autonomous College under the UGC guidelines, the college ventured to develop its curriculum from time to time in order to enable our graduates to compete in different, changing, life situations. The college, for the first time among the colleges in Manipur, could adopt Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) curriculum scheme of the UGC from 2020-21 session. Recently the College has got "Star College" under the scheme of DBT, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India for developing Science Departments.

#### Facilities and Services

- College Library: The College offers a Central Library with a rapidly increasing collection of books, periodicals, journals etc. It has a good stock of text and reference books. Library users can access book database of books, ejournals and other e-resources. Besides, each Department has developed a library of their own.
- Computer facilities: The computer learning center of the College provides computer facilities accessible to the students with basic knowledge. The Computer center situated within the campus is specially meant for the students. Every Department is also provided computer facilities for easy access of both the teachers and students as well.
- Hostel Facility: The College has separate hostels for boys and girls located within the campus. The intake capacity of the Boys Hostel is 24 students and it has a spacious environment with a big dining hall, a playground and warden's quarter. The Girls Hostel has intake capacity of 36 students with many facilities.

- 2. **Health Care Facility:** Health care facility is available at the Primary Health Sub-Centre which is located adjacent to the College.
- 3. Games and Sports: The College provides opportunities for students to excel in various fields of sports. It has a spacious playground for playing cricket, volleyball, football and other outdoor games. There is an Indoor Stadium with playing facilities of badminton, table tennis, carom etc. under flood light and a well -equipped Gymnasium. A swimming pool of modern standard is developed in the college to enhance sport activities to the students.
- 4. **Multipurpose Hall:** The College has a multipurpose hall of about 400 sitting capacity. Various indoor games like T.T., badminton, carom, etc. can be conducted here. Moreover, seminars, workshops and other co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are also conducted here.
- 5. The college has an Echo Park and three Botanical Gardens.
- Alumni Association: The College has an Alumni Association with a large number of members giving contribution to the growth and development of the Institution.
- 7. **Women Forum:** The College has a Women Forum to open a study centre specially for women's (working women & girl students) advancement of the state in particular and North East in general. Various dimensions of women and children are the focus areas of its activities.
- 8. **Incentive Awards:** Outstanding students in curricular and co-curricular activities are given recognition and awards. There is a merit-cum-cash award given to students securing

higher mark in Honours subjects and stream toppers in the examinations of B.A/B.Sc. courses. A number of scholarships are also available sponsored by the state and central Governments and other agencies.

- Cultural activities: The College organizes different cultural activities from time to time and the students are also encouraged to participate in various cultural programmes both inside and outside the state.
- 10. Cafeteria: There is a well-furnished cafeteria in the College campus to cater to the taste of teachers and students.

The college has developed 2 (two) laboratories in addition to laboratories of nine subjects:

- i. Biotech Hub funded by DBT, New Delhi.
- ii. Luminescence DOSIMETRY Laboratory at Physics Dept. funded by AERB, Mumbai.
- 11. Career & Counseling Cell: In the 11th plan, the UGC provided financial assistance to set up a career & counselling cell. In 2010, the cell was set up and it has already organized several counseling programmes for students.

# SUBJECTS / COURSES TO BE TAUGHT IN 1ST YEAR (SEMESTER I & II) OF THE DEGREE PROGRAMME

- The College offers UG Honours programmes in Arts and Science courses only.
- In the Semester I, the following Courses / Papers shall be taught
  - i. 2 (two) Papers of Honours Core Course (HC)
  - ii. 1 (one) Paper of General English (GEN) or MIL-Manipuri (MAN)
  - iii. 1 (one) add-on skill enhancement course
  - iv. 2 (two) Papers on value addition course
- In the Semester II, the above structure shall follow with different subsequent Papers except the (ii), which shall be replaced by 1 (one) Paper of Environmental Studies (EVS).

#### ADMISSION CRITERIA AND PROCEDURE

- All the candidates seeking admission to Undergraduate Courses in the college are require to fill in the prescribed admission form and submit online for all categories (General/OBC/SC/ST/PWD). However, the admission form along with necessary documents should be submitted at the time of counselling. This is mandatory for all candidates.
- 2. There shall be a cut off marks for all the courses decided by the Admission Committee from time to time. This year the cut off marks is 55% for Science and 50% for Arts. There shall be permissible relaxation for reserved categories as well as for candidates of outstanding sports and cultural performance as per existing rules. The selection of candidates for admission to B.A./B.Sc. 1st Semester shall be on the basis of class XII results of the Council of Higher Secondary Education, Manipur/ other Boards recognised by the Manipur University.
- 3. After duly considering the reservation rule of the state government, the final selected lists of Arts and Science will be declared. The selected students need to report to the College office for admission within the stipulated period. No request will be entertained after the last date.
- 4. The data of all candidates who are admitted to the College will be made available on regular basis on College website immediately. The same may be completed and sent to the University and the State Directorate of University and Higher Education for information within a week of last date of admission.

#### Students' Code Of Conduct

#### Attendance Requirement

All students must attend every lecture, tutorial and practical classes. The minimum attendance requirement will be 75% of the classes held. Students with deficiency in attendance in a course will be awarded discollegiate grade in a course and will not be allowed to sit in the Semester end examination of the current session (Not Negotiable).

#### **Proctorial Rules**

Proctorial system has been introduced in the college for developing lose contact between the students and teachers for timely guidance and advice in academic and other matters. Under this system a batch of 20-25 students keep under the control of a teacher (proctor), meets as per dates & places previously fixed. They put forth their difficulties before the proctor for advice, information regarding the academic performance, attendance in the class etc.

#### STUDENTS MENTORING SYSTEM

Students Mentoring Programme has been introduced in the college. The new entrants that is the first Semester students are mentored in groups by the students of fifth Semester students. As per the rules in vogue, the mentors and their mentee groups are notified after admission of the session. The practice of mentoring system has proved highly useful to both the mentee and the mentor.

#### Instruction And Methodology

The medium of instruction/examination in the college at all levels is done exclusively in English except Manipuri language. In framing the courses, care has been taken to see that they are not burdened with formal lectures only. There is adequate provisions for seminars, tutorials, case studies, guided field work and study tour programmes, group discussion and quizzes etc. as an integral part of teaching pedagogy to help the students in increasing their analytical capability and creativity thereby enhancing the course and programme objectives and outcomes.

#### **Evaluation System**

The students are evaluated following relative grading system which is basically internal. In order to make sure that the students do not have to rely on any one or two major examination for evaluation, the college follows a Continuous Comprehensive Internal Assessment (CIA) system of 40% mark where the assessments are spread across the entire semester through unit tests, home assignments, seminars, quiz, group discussion, projects, etc. and remaining 60% marks will be evaluated from the semester end examinations. A letter

grade signifies the level of standard of qualitative, quantitative academic achievement, which a student attains in a particular course.

# ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR APPEARING IN A SEMESTER END-EXAMINATION

## Students are to fulfill/pass the following CIA components of every Paper of the Semester:

1. **Attendance:** At least 75% of the total number of classes held of every subject/ paper in the semester.

- 2. **Unit Test:** In a semester, minimum number of unit test to be appeared per paper/subject is 4(four) securing at least 40% marks in every test.
- 3. **Home Assignment** of every paper/subject should be submitted within the stipulated time of the Semester.
- 4. **Seminar:** Seminar on an assigned topic should be presented for every paper in the Semester.
- 5. **Project work** is compulsory and report of the same should be submitted within the stipulated time.
- 6. **Quiz:** Quiz should be participated scoring not less than 40% marks in every paper of the Semester.
- 7. **Group Discussion:** Group Discussion should be participated scoring not less than 40% marks in every paper of the Semester.

#### Criteria For Pass And Promotion

- Obtaining a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate in each Elective Course of the Semester End Examination and teacher's internal evaluation (CIA), and a minimum of 35% in the aggregate in each Foundation Courses (FC), Value-added Courses (VAC) and other enrichment courses shall be essential for passing the Semester and promoting to the next higher semester.
- Find Examination shall be allowed to promote to the next higher semester, for which paper(s) they have to appear in the next corresponding examination as BACK. However, no student will be promoted to the next higher semester if he/she has failed in 4(four) or more papers at a time.
